***From the Pastor's Desk***

Like many of you, I'm outraged, heart-broken, and confused by what's happening in our nation. I want to scream, "We are better than this!" How many times do we have to see racial injustice before it's stopped? How many counter-productive reactions need to take place before we figure out the right way to do good? It may seem like we can do very little right now, but we actually *do* have several choices.

First, we can choose to listen – to stop talking, stop posting on Facebook, and start listening. At times, the privileges of life in small-town America shelter us from the pain others experience. In college, I worked at an inner-city church in Chicago. It was in a dangerous neighborhood. Gangs like the Latin Kings, Vice Lords, and Gaylords dominated. We *never* walked the streets alone. I wondered what it would be like to live in that area, to have to protect my family from the dangers. I could not imagine having to warn my kid that the man in blue might be the one to kneel on his neck. But I could never really understand that life, not even after working there. At the end of a day at that Chicago church, I simply hopped into the Wheaton College van and rode back to secluded suburbia, to a campus with its own security guards, to my safe dorm room. But, what if I *didn't* have the choice to live outside of that dangerous, inner-city neighborhood? What opinions would I have about the current issues in America? Do we listen only to those who have the same life choices we do? What if we were to listen to those who don't?

Second, we can choose to listen to the Lord of All. To ask ourselves what we need to repent of in these difficult times. To kneel before our Maker and pray for forgiveness and reconciliation in our nation. To entrust into His hands the things that we have no power over. To pray for our leaders and elected officials. To pray for peace and ask the Lord to make us agents of that peace.

Third, we can choose to make a difference where we are now, to stand alongside those who don't have a voice right here in our community. Coming alongside of others through our work with Jubilee Ministry and our outreach to Whitstran School are good starts, but can we do more? Can we do more to honor our Prosser police officers as shining examples of the good and courageous public servants that they are? Can we tell them how much we value and appreciate them? Each of us has choices: to stew in frustration, to lash out in anger, or to be some part of the solution right here and now. What will you choose?


